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In the field of music the term 'performance' can acquire different meanings depending on repertoires and historical periods: the embodiment in sound of a musical idea which is only partially or approximately conceived and dependent on the performer's subjectivity, the reproduction of a musical text which is defined in the score with the greatest precision, or the extemporary invention of musical situations which are strictly related to the context.

Each specific aspect of this complex matter is studied by historical musicology and ethnomusicology. Both disciplines agree upon the decisive importance of the realization in sound, without which a musical culture cannot exist, and developed theoretical approaches along autonomous paths so far. The objective of the seminar, at its second edition, is to confront research experiences in performance practice in the fields of Western art music and music of oral tradition. At the core of the project is musical performance in its wide range of intertwined aspects: gestural, bodily, visual, tactile, interactive, social.
