1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

From 27 to 30 June 2018, the Fondazione Giorgio Cini Institute of Music, Venice, in collaboration with the Hochschule der Künste Bern and the Conservatorio Benedetto Marcello, Venice, has organised a workshop for flutists and guitarists, experienced in performing and with interests in 20th century music.

The Workshop aims to encourage collaboration between composers, musicologists and instrumentalists in performances based on the in-depth study of musical structures, the sources of the compositional process and documentation of historical performances. The study and research context for the course is intended to foster the transmission of an experience of compositional thinking, composers' poetics and specific instrumental techniques. The repertoire will be based on composers with works for flute and for guitar preserved in the Institute of Music Archives at the Fondazione Giorgio Cini, Venice.

The first three days of the Workshop are divided into theoretical morning sessions and musical practice afternoon sessions with a special focus on the compositional methods of Niccolò Castiglioni, Domenico Guaccero, Giacomo Manzoni, Fausto Romitelli and Camillo Togni. The fourth and last day will be entirely devoted to the practice of music and the participating students will be able to play in a demonstration concert in the afternoon.

The Workshop is part of the "Research-led Performance" series, which is based on the close collaboration between musicologists and performers. On one hand, performance practice is consolidated by taking into account the results of archive research and theoretical studies; and, on the other, scholarly investigation makes use of the experience of performing and listening to verify, refine or redefine its own path. When combined, these joint activities generate a new, dynamic research method.

The instrumental teachers are: Elena Casoli (Hochschule der Künste Bern) and Florindo Baldissera (Conservatorio di Venezia) for guitar, Federica Lotti (Conservatorio di Venezia) and Martin Fahlenbock (Hochschule der Künste Bern) for flute. The musicological sessions will be led by Gianmario Borio, Angela Carone, Paolo Dal Molin, Susanna Pasticci and Francisco Rocca.

The workshop will focus on the following compositions:

At the end of the first day, the teachers will perform some of the pieces to be studied during the workshop.

2. HOW TO APPLY

The selected candidates will be able to attend the workshop, without any registration fee, either as participants or as auditors. The number of places available are:

- 8 participants with scholarships
- 8 auditors (who take no active part in the lessons)

The participants with scholarships will attend the workshop along with 8 students from the Hochschule der Künste, Bern and 8 students from the Conservatorio Benedetto Marcello, Venice, previously selected by the teachers involved in the project.

At the end of the workshop, all the participants will receive a certificate of attendance provided they have taken part in all the sessions (100% attendance).

For the scholarship winners, the Institute of Music at the Fondazione Giorgio Cini provides free of charge:

- accommodation from 26 to 30 June 2018 (inclusive) in the Residence of the Vittore Branca International Center for the Study of Italian Culture on the Island of San Giorgio Maggiore;
- lunches and dinners from 27 to 30 June (inclusive).

To participate in the selection, candidates must send their applications by email (concorsimusica@cini.it) by 30 April 2018 with the following documentation:

- The application form with every part completed.
- Curriculum Vitae including study courses completed and / or in progress and any professional experience in the field of music history. The CV must also provide full personal data, addresses and contact details and must be accompanied by the candidate's signed consent for processing personal data for the sole purpose of the workshop.
- Short personal statement including reasons for participating (max 2 typed pages).
- 1 link to an audio / video clip in streaming (or downloadable) of at least 1 track performed by the candidate with a fixed camera/microphone and no cuts (i.e. with no editing).

NB: Only individual candidates may apply. Participants are requested to bring their own instruments to the workshop.

3. REQUIRED SKILLS

To fully benefit from the workshop, candidates are required to have the following skills and motivation:

- Ability to play classical guitar or flute to a professional standard;
- Sufficient knowledge of Italian to understand and interpret the sources to be examined during the workshop theory and practice;
- Sufficient knowledge of English to be able to follow easily all the different contexts of the Workshop;
- Good reasons for participating in the project.

As soon as the selection is completed, the music scores to be used in the workshop and any other supporting material will be made available to the winners only.

The participants are required to prepare at least one piece of music from the above list, which will then be studied further with the teachers in the collective sessions and individual lessons.

4. SELECTION CRITERIA

The applications will be examined and assessed by a special commission, composed of Florindo Baldissera, Elena Casoli, Martin Fahlenbock and Federica Lotti, who will draw up a ranking with particular emphasis on the following criteria:

- The candidate's previous experience and specific training with the required instrument;
 participation as a composer or performer at concerts, workshops and seminars;
- Reasons for participating in line with the educational aims of the workshop and an aptitude
 to collaborate with other musicians. The participant's willingness to elaborate shared ideas
 and engage in dialogue and cultural exchanges will be evaluated positively.

The judging commission reserves the right to be able to contact candidates directly for possible interviews or to gain further information about their profiles and specific interests.

The results of the selection will be communicated to candidates by email and published on www.cini.it on 15 May 2018.

The successful candidates must confirm their participation within 10 days of receiving the notification email and in any case no later than 25 May 2018, otherwise they will be excluded from the ranking.
