Starting from the presentation of specific case studies, the discussion will explore key questions of contemporary creativity: new conceptions of dramaturgy; the choice and assemblage of texts; different ways of understanding plot and character; treatment of the voice; and the use of technology within artistic planning.

Bringing together musicologists and dramaturgists the round table aims to delineate between theory and practice the current orientation of experimental music theatre as well as the production system as a whole.
